

## Goals for 2018/2019

1. Continue to support the Club's numerous service projects. Consider the addition of one new fundraising event during the winter months to increase the Activities Budget revenues.
2. Continue to increase membership rolls and more importantly foster membership retention. Consider increasing membership at a 5% rate this coming year and encourage new members to participate in service activities as soon as possible. Remember, we are all **RECRUITERS**.
3. The Club has currently 27 Committee and Event Chairpersons. To ensure leadership continuity and stability, this year I have added a Vice Chair position to most. I have contacted members over the summer to see where they would like to serve. If you feel I missed you and you have a desire to serve as a committee lead or help out with an event, please let me know.
4. The "Buddy System" created last year has provided a number of positive attributes to support Club camaraderie. This year, I have again listed buddies in teams, grouped largely by their sponsors as much possible, with the first "buddy" team member highlighted in bold. I trust this member will take the lead and encourage his/her team members to attend meetings regularly and possibly travel to meetings together and support each other as the case arises.
5. Provide all new members with Member Orientation/Mentoring training.
6. Continue the "color code" dinner meeting system to promote additional fellowship periodically.
7. Provide a Club Assessment Report to members describing the positive things the Club is doing.
8. Provide volunteer drivers, case interviewers, and general support to the LOVRNET program. Expand the Club's Transportation Committee's policy to provide volunteer drivers for county-wide eye-impaired patients traveling to doctor appointments.
9. Conduct a Community Assessment Survey to see how both town and county leaders think we are doing as a Club.
10. Provide "Roaring Lion" public speaker training for those members interested in improving their public speaking skills.
