**Past District Governor  
Frederick Henry Wehrenberg**

Frederick Henry Wehrenberg died Sunday, January 18, 2015 in Chicago, Illinois. His paternal grandparents were from Liebenau, West Germany. His parents were John Martin Wehrenberg, from Baltimore City and Inez Lille Wants Wehrenberg, from Carroll County in Maryland. In 1933, the family moved to the Pimlico area where he spent his early childhood. He graduated from Forest Park High School in 1942 and was immediately employed by the Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone Company. He spent three years in the Air Force during World War II. He attained the rank of Staff Sergeant as a radio operator and his tour flying with the 311th Troop Carrier Squadron covered most of the Pacific Ocean area. He married Virginia Jarosinski from Chicago, IL while he was a member of the Air Force.

His main hobby was operating his Amateur Radio Station "W3MAI". He was always active in community affairs. He served as Scout Master of Troop 108 for many years in the Pimlico area and also as a local Neighborhood Commissioner for the Boy Scouts of America in Carroll County MD. He served as Carroll County Chairman of the Easter Seals Campaign and was also a Past President of many civic organizations, including The Westminster Civitan Club, The Westminster Little League, The Westminster Parent Teachers Association of Westminster High School and the St. Paul's Men's Brotherhood. He also served as as officer of the German Society of Maryland from 1975-1981 when he was elected President of the Society. He remained in the office until 1983. He was also a member of the Executive Committee of the Society for the History of Germans in Maryland.

While living in the Pikesville area, he served as President of the Pikesville Lions Club in 1972. Subsequently he also served the International Association of Lions Clubs as Zone Chairman, a Deputy District Governor, a Cabinet Secretary and as Governor of District 22-A in 1978. In 1979, he was awarded the Governor's Citation from Harry Hughes, Governor of the State of MD, for his outstanding service to the citizens of the state.

After the death of his wife Virginia, he moved from Sykesville, MD to Chicago, IL. In 1988 he married Beverly Smigiel and established residence in the Wildwood Community northwest of Chicago. His wife Beverly, and one daughter Inez Anders, who are residents of Glenview, IL, survive him.
